For Further Study

- 1. While the Bible clearly points to God's design for marriage, the Bible also has much to say about singleness. The apostle Paul was single and celebrated the advantages he experienced as a single man in 1 Corinthians 7:7-8 and 7:32-35. Jesus also never married, and he recognized those who choose not to marry for the sake of the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 19:12). God also spoke through the prophet Isaiah of special rewards for those who are not married, who bore no children, and who were pleasing to Him in Isaiah 56:1-7.
- While Jesus held a very high view of marriage, He spoke even more highly of relationships we can have with Him and with others who believe in Him. Look at these passages for examples: Matthew 22:23-30, Luke 11:27, Mark 10:29-30, Matthew 12:48-49, John 17:3.
- 3. The implications of 1 Corinthians 12:12-26 are vast. Everyone is different—we all have different gifts, personalities, life experiences, and yet are one body. This passage exposes our need for community and our need for diverse community. In Hebrews 10:23-25, notice the "us" throughout this passage. The writer of Hebrews is speaking to the community of faith and the role everybody plays to "one another." This passage challenges us to consider how to encourage one another to live in light of the gospel, v.24, and to sacrifice for biblical community, v.25.
